At North Carolina Outward Bound School, we will guide you on the first step of a journey that will continue the rest of your life. On the outside, you may be climbing mountains, paddling rapids or navigating your way through forests in some of the most beautiful wilderness areas in the world. Inside, you will go far beyond what you thought you knew about yourself, your capabilities and your limits. Our world-class educators support, encourage and inspire you to discover your potential, but it is you who tackles the challenge.

On our courses students will work together to live, work and travel in the wilderness. Through these experiences, participants learn important skills for life, such as leadership, communication, conflict resolution, and teamwork. A large part of Outward Bound focuses on group dynamics and development. However, it can be a very personal experience as well. By conquering their own challenges, participants discover their true potential and realize 'there is more in them than they know.'

Educational Approach

Learning Through Experience

Outward Bound students move through a sequence of engaging experiences that promote skill, mastery and incorporate reflection. Through these challenges, students are given the opportunity to learn from their success as well as failure in a safe, compassionate environment.

Challenge and Adventure

The unfamiliar settings where Outward Bound expeditions occur challenge our students mentally, emotionally and physically. Amidst the demands of the expedition, students learn to manage risk appropriately, but also to utilize it as a tool for growth.

Supportive Environment

Each expedition is designed to support physical and emotional safety. Skilled and compassionate instructors use group facilitation methods and the natural world to help foster a caring, positive and inclusive group culture that is optimal for learning.

Program Locations and Activities

North Carolina Outward Bound School (NCOBS) offers year-round courses that range anywhere from 4 to 72-days. Historically our School was founded in North Carolina, however our course areas include the Blue Ridge Mountains and Outer Banks of North Carolina, the Ten Thousand Islands and Central Rivers of Florida and the mountains of Patagonia in South America. During our traditional wilderness courses, participants engage with a number of activities such as backpacking, rock climbing, sea kayaking, whitewater canoeing, and service learning. No prior experience is necessary. You just have to be willing to dig deep, embrace the moment and tackle the challenge. Financial aid and academic credit is available for many of our courses.
