**Application Fee** - Covers the in-house cost of processing your application to attend the course. **This fee is non-refundable.**

**Transportation Fee** - Covers intracourse transportation by NCOBS vehicles. **This fee does not cover:**

The cost of your transportation to the course start in San Carlos de Bariloche Argentina.

The cost of your plane ticket from San Carlos de Bariloche Argentina to Miami, Florida

The cost of your transportation home from the course end in Charlotte, North Carolina.

**Tuition** - Covers all costs associated with the programming of the course; food, gear, permits and staff.

## Entry Fee

The Argentine government requires an entry fee of \$140 (subject to change) payable upon entering Argentina. The fee can be paid in U.S. dollars, on a credit card or with travelers checks. North Carolina Outward Bound does not cover this fee.

## Extra Money

You will need some spending money during the course. You will need money for laundry, extra batteries or film, and any meals or miscellaneous items you choose to purchase during town visits or travel days. You may also need to pay for replacement costs of damaged or lost North Carolina Outward Bound gear. We suggest you bring at least \$200 (past students have recommended \$500) mixed between cash and a debit card OR a credit card with a PIN number to cover these incidental expenses. We suggest that you purchase a money belt or traveler's neck pouch to carry your passport, plane tickets and cash.

## Airline Tickets

Airline travel to and from Argentina can cost between \$1000 and \$2000. You are responsible for getting yourself to San Carlos de Bariloche, Argentina for course start. You are responsible for purchasing a ticket from San Carlos de Bariloche to Miami, Florida to begin Phase II. You must be booked on the flight we recommend from Bariloche Argentina to Miami, Florida. (See your Travel Information sheet, page 2, Phase II.)

## Clothing and Gear Costs

Please read the enclosed clothing and gear list carefully. Hiking boots and Gore-Tex garments can be expensive. Participants typically end up spending between \$1000 - \$1500 dollars to purchase the necessary clothing and equipment. ## Medical/Travel Insurance and Evacuation Costs

In the event that you require a visit to a medical facility during your course, you are responsible for all costs incurred during that event. This includes paying for any outside assistance that may be used during the evacuation. Please be certain to bring your insurance card to course with you and submit a copy (front and back) of your card when you send in your required forms.

## Passports

A passport is required for entry into Argentina. Passport applications may take two to three months to process so apply well in advance of your departure date. Passport numbers must be submitted to Outward Bound no later than two weeks before the start of the course to ensure that we can complete permits necessary for traveling in Patagonia. Make four clear photocopies of your passport. Mail or fax two copies to our office with your required forms. Bring two copies with your passport to the course.
